Her hobby was writing and she had worked as a reporter for the Deseret News. She was a member of the League of Utah Writers, Blue Quill of Ogden, Scribblers of San Bernardino.

Survivors include her husband and two sons, Richard B. Anderson, presently at Harvard University, Cambridge, Mass., and D. Brent Anderson, a missionary in the French East Mission.

Wife Of French Mission President Dies In Crash

BORDEAUX, FRANCE—Mrs. Leola S. Anderson, 57, wife of H. Duane Anderson, president of the French Mission of The Church of Jesus Christ of Latter-day Saints, was killed Sunday in a head-on collision near Bordeaux.

Pres. Anderson, 55, suffered eight broken ribs and a broken wrist in the accident.

Willard (Mitt) Romney, 21, son of Gov. George Romney of Michigan, who is serving a mission in France and who was driving the car, suffered minor head injuries and torn ligaments in one elbow. He was expected to leave the hospital in about two days.

Elder Romney's missionary companion, David Wood, 21, son of Mr. and Mrs. David C. Wood, 1744 E. 13th South Salt Lake City, suffered minor injuries but was not hospitalized.

A spokesman at the LDS mission in Paris said the party was traveling from Bordeaux to Pallon on church business when their car collided with an auto that

village of Bazas, 35 miles southeast of Bordeaux. Mrs. Anderson died two hours after the accident.

President and Mrs. Anderson were both professors at San Bernardino Valley College at San Bernardino, Calif., before he was named the French Mission president in May 1967.

Mrs. Leola Seely Anderson was born June 19, 1910, in Salt Lake City, a daughter of Arta M. and Alfaretta Neff Seely. She married H. Duane Anderson June 5, 1936, in the Salt Lake Temple.

She attended Box Elder High School in Brigham City, Utah State University and Brigham Young University, receiving a B.S. degree in 1955. She also did graduate work at the University of California.

Her church positions included institute instructor at San Bernardino Valley College, stake publicity director, YWMIA stake presidency and president; Relief Society literature teacher,
