Funeral services for Mrs. Lora H. Thompson, 82, Provo, Utah, former Malta resident, who died at 12:45 p.m. Monday in Provo, will be conducted at 1 p.m. Saturday at the Provo LDS Thirteenth Ward Chapel, 945 East Eighth North. Burial will be in Orem, Utah, Cemetery.

In addition to other information given in Mrs. Thompson's obituary yesterday, it is noted that she waited on Butch Cassidy at her father's store in Price, Utah at the age of 13; she sang under the baton of Evan Stevens with the Mormon Tabernacle Choir in 1913; and filled a church mission in Independence, Jackson County, Mo.

Mrs. Lora H. Thompson, 82, Provo, Utah, former Malta resident, died at 12:45 p.m. Monday in Provo.

She was born May 11, 1892 at Huntington, Utah, and married J. Henry Thompson Oct. 6, 1920 in the Salt Lake City LDS Temple. They moved immediately to Malta and lived there most of their lives. Mr. Thompson served as Malta postmaster for 42 years.

Mrs. Thompson was active in music circles all her life, learning to sing before she learned to talk. All of her family, as well as Mr. Thompson, are also musical, and are well known for music performances in Cassia County and other areas.

She has also held many positions in the LDS Church.

Surviving are her husband of Provo; four sons, John H. Thompson, Rexburg, Joseph E. Thompson, Pocatello, Robert H. Thompson, Burley, and Samuel O. Thompson, Boise; three daughters, Jane Thompson, Provo, Dorothy Collier, Layton, Utah, and Carolyn Lee, California; two brothers, Wilford Glenn Harmon, California, and Joseph Willard Harmon, Wyoming; and 30 grandchildren.

She was preceded in death by four sisters' and five brothers.

Lora Thompson, Mother of BYU Musician Dies

Lora Harmon Thompson, 82 of 131 N. 1000 E., Provo, died Monday at the Utah Valley Care Center of natural causes.

She was born May 11, 1892 in Huntington, Emery County, a daughter of Oliver John and Almira Terry Harmon. She married John Henry Thompson on Oct. 6, 1920 in the Salt Lake LDS Temple.

Mrs. Thompson received her early education in Huntington and Price. She attended the University of Utah and studied music with Prof. Alfred Best. She served a mission for the LDS Church in 1917-19 in the Central States, serving as mission clerk. Following their marriage, they made their home in Malta, Ida., where she worked as a postal clerk for 40 years. They moved to Provo in 1961 and had lived here since that time.

Mrs. Thompson was a soloist with the Salt Lake Oratorio Society and a member of the LDS Tabernacle Choir. She served on the Relief Society, Stake Board, in the YWMA, and as Primary president. She was a member of the Daughters of Utah Pioneers and served as captain. She was also affiliated with the Retired Postal Workers.

Mr. and Mrs. Thompson celebrated their 50th wedding anniversary in August, 1970. She enjoyed music, especially singing, and taught her children to love music.

Surviving are her husband of Provo; four sons and three daughters, Dr. John Harmon Thompson of Rexburg, Ida.; Dr. Joseph Edward Thompson of Pocatello, Ida.; Robert Henry Thompson of Burley, Ida.; Samuel Oliver Thompson of Pocatello, Ida.; Miss Janie Thompson of Provo; Mrs. Don (Dorothy) Collier of Layton; and Mrs. Thomas W. (Carolyn) Lee of San Leandro, Calif.; 29 grandchildren; three brothers and a sister, W. Glen Harmon of Berkeley, Calif.; John Harold Harmon of El Cerrito, Calif.; Joseph Willard Harmon of Layton, Calif.; and Mrs. Zelma Harmon of Salt Lake City.
