Subj: Orders to Active Military Service - Advance Notice of

1. If you are eligible, it is planned to issue you orders to report for physical examination during the month of JULY, and, if found physically qualified, to report for active military service during the month of AUGUST.

2. At the present time, you will be considered ineligible for involuntary recall to active military service for any of the following reasons:

- a. You have dependents.
- b. You are a high school student.
- c. You are under the minimum age limit for induction by the Selective Service Act (currently 19 years is the minimum age for induction).
- d. Have had more than six (6) months prior active Naval or Coast Guard duty other than in connection with the Naval Reserve Program.
- e. Have had more than ninety (90) days active duty prior to 24 June 1948.

3. If you are ineligible for any of the reasons as listed in paragraph 2 above, you are directed to so advise the Commandant, TWELFTH Naval District, Attention: 11E-3D, and provide substantiation documents as evidence of your ineligibility. Enclose a copy of this letter. Should no reply to the letter be received within fifteen (15) days, you will be considered eligible for recall and orders will be issued as indicated in paragraph 1.

4. If you feel that active military service at the time specified in paragraph 1 above would constitute a hardship, you may request a deferment. Such requests must be fully substantiated with affidavits; inasmuch as you have the privilege of making an appeal to the Navy Department Review Board in the event the Commandant disapproves your request for deferment, you are directed to submit all correspondence and affidavits pertaining thereto in duplicate. Enclose a copy of this letter. Address all such correspondence to Commandant, TWELFTH Naval District, Attention: 11E-3D, San Francisco 2, California.

5. Reservists shall be afforded the opportunity to execute agreements to extend enlistments for 1, 2, or 3 years as necessary to meet obligated service requirements, which at the present time are 21 months from date of reporting. If assigned to an organized drilling unit, your Commanding Officer is hereby directed to execute a voluntary extension of enlistment at your request for a period of 1, 2, or 3 years in accordance with TWELFTH Naval District Organized Reserve Memorandum 51-11 and TWELFTH Naval District Volunteer Reserve Memorandum 51-7, if you do not have required obligated service. Should you not desire to voluntarily extend your enlistment, your Commanding Officer is directed to immediately transfer you to Class V-6 of the Volunteer Reserve and notify your local Selective Service Board of your change in status.

6. Keep the Commandant, TWELFTH Naval District, attention: 11E-3D, informed of any change of address.


1. Receipt of your referenced letter is acknowledged.

- (c) Your request for deferment is not approved. Carry out basic orders.
- (d) Sufficient evidence was not submitted with your request. Resubmit immediately substantiating affidavits or other official evidence.

- (f) Submit photostatic copies of your children's birth certificates and a photostatic copy of your marriage license.

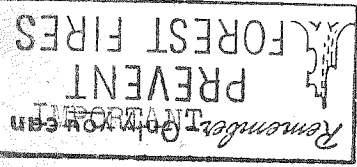

On May 22, 1951, I received notice to report to the office of Division 12-53 at the Naval Reserve Training Center, Fort Douglas, Utah concerning my orders to active duty.

At the present time I feel that I am ineligible for involuntary recall to active service for the reason that I have a wife and baby as dependents.

I feel that active military service would constitute a hardship not only because of my dependents as mentioned above, but due to the fact that such service would necessitate the disposal of certain properties now in my possession and would also result in the loss of a very important position in connection with my employment. This position, which I recently was installed into culminated a training period of over two years.

My present four year term of enlistment in the Naval Reserve will terminate on August 4, 1951. I do not wish to extend my enlistment in the Naval Reserve for any additional period nor, due to reasons as above stated, do I wish to go into active duty.

In view of the information as above stated, I hereby respectfully make a request for deferment from active service.
