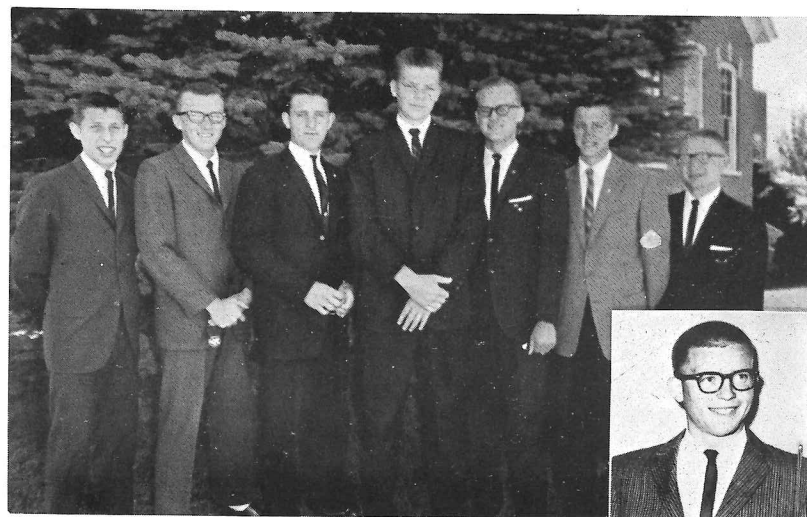

HISTORY OF THE BRIGHAM CITY NINTH WARD

ON JUNE 29, 1958, THE BRIGHAM CITY NINTH WARD WAS ORGANIZED. A DIVISION OF THE BRIGHAM SECOND WARD MADE THIS EVENT POSSIBLE. RUDGAR N. PRICE, FIRST COUNSELOR IN THE SOUTH BOX ELDER STAKE PRESIDENCY, PRESIDED AT THE MEETING AND MADE THE DIVISION.

CLAUDIUS B. OLSEN, WHO HAD BEEN THE BISHOP OF THE SECOND WARD, WAS SUSTAINED AS THE FIRST BISHOP OF THE NINTH WARD. JAMES DIXON WAS SELECTED TO BE HIS FIRST COUNSELOR WITH GARTH COLTON AS SECOND COUNSELOR. HORACE LITTLEWOOD WAS THE WARD CLERK, AND EARL SHEFFIELD WAS THE FINANCIAL CLERK. THE MEMBERSHIP OF THE WARD AT THIS TIME NUMBERED 419. ALTHOUGH THE MEMBERSHIP WAS SMALL THE WARD BECAME VERY ZEALOUS, AND ALMOST IMMEDIATELY IT COULD BE ASCERTAINED THAT "THIS WAS TO BE THE START OF SOMETHING BIG!"

UNDER THE DIRECTION OF A VERY CAPABLE BISHOPRIC, THE AUXILIARIES WERE ORGANIZED AND THE WORK OF THE NEW WARD WAS UNDER WAY. DAVID ERICKSON WAS CALLED TO BE THE SUPERINTENDENT OF THE SUNDAY SCHOOL WITH BOYD JEPPESEN AS FIRST ASSISTANT, DEE MITTON AS SECOND ASSISTANT, AND EVA VALENTINE AS SECRETARY. THE RELIEF SOCIETY WAS LED BY GRACE HARRISON AS PRESIDENT WITH JEAN MADSEN, FIRST COUNSELOR, LUCY COPPIN, SECOND COUNSELOR, AND ESTHER ANDERSEN, SECRETARY. MARY MILLER WAS SET APART AS PRESIDENT OF THE PRIMARY. SHE CHOSE MARVA FROST AS HER FIRST COUNSELOR AND LORAL ERICKSON AS HER SECOND COUNSELOR, WITH THORA DICKAMORE AS SECRETARY. THE Y.M.M.I.A. WAS ORGANIZED AS FOLLOWS: ALBERT WATSON, SUPERINTENDENT; LYNN RICHMAN, FIRST ASSISTANT; AND DON CHRISTENSEN, SECOND ASSISTANT. THE PRESIDENT OF THE Y.W.M.I.A. WAS EVADEAN MITTON WITH LAURENA JEPPESEN AS AGE GROUP COUNSELOR, EVA JANE WATSON AS ACTIVITY COUNSELOR, ELLA ANDERSON AS SECRETARY, AND ALFREDA VALENTINE AS ATTENDANCE SECRETARY. THE GENEALOGICAL COMMITTEE CONSISTED OF NORMAN ANDERSEN, ESTHER ANDERSEN, RALPH REEDER, RUTH REEDER, HORACE LITTLEWOOD, AND RENIE LITTLEWOOD. THOMAS KIMBER WAS CALLED TO BE HIGH PRIESTS' GROUP LEADER WITH JOHN CHRISTENSEN AS FIRST COUNSELOR, OSCAR CALL AS SECOND COUNSELOR, AND ELMER HOPKINS AS SECRETARY. LAST, BUT NOT LEAST, THE ELDERS QUORUM WAS PRESIDED OVER BY JAMES VALENTINE, PRESIDENT; WAYNE JENSEN, FIRST COUNSELOR; REED OLSEN, SECOND COUNSELOR; AND EMERY WHEELER, SECRETARY. UNDER THE LEADERSHIP OF THESE FINE MEN AND WOMEN, THE NEW WARD BEGAN TO GROW, DEVELOP, AND EXPAND. MANY OF THESE FIRST OFFICERS HAVE NOW MOVED AWAY FROM THE WARD, BUT THEY WILL BE REMEMBERED WITH FONDNESS, FOR THEY WERE RESPONSIBLE FOR THE FOUNDATION UPON WHICH WE ARE NOW BUILDING AND ADDING EVEN GREATER HEIGHTS.

GARTH COLTON WAS CALLED TO THE HIGH COUNCIL OF THE STAKE, AND EARL SHEFFIELD WAS CALLED TO SERVE AS THE STAKE FINANCIAL CLERK. CONSEQUENTLY, A CHANGE WAS MADE IN THE BISHOPRIC, WITH LYNN RICHMAN SUSTAINED AS SECOND COUNSELOR AND DEE MITTON AS FINANCIAL CLERK.

THE STAKE WAS DIVIDED IN MAY OF 1963. BISHOP CLAUDIUS OLSEN WAS CALLED AT THIS TIME TO SERVE AS A MEMBER OF THE HIGH COUNCIL OF THE BOX ELDER STAKE. KENNETH F. GODFREY WAS SELECTED TO BE THE NEW BISHOP. HE CHOSE REED A. OLSEN AS HIS FIRST COUNSELOR AND R. ROSS BOWMAN AS SECOND COUNSELOR WITH WILLIS D. CRANER, WARD CLERK; ANDREW ELDRIDGE, FINANCIAL CLERK; AND ELDON M. HANSEN, WARD TEACHING CLERK. THE NEW BISHOPRIC WAS SET APART ON JUNE 2, 1963.

TO COMMEMORATE THE FIRST ANNIVERSARY OF THE NINTH WARD, A PARTY WAS INSTIGATED. THIS PARTY WAS HELD AT THE BOWERY OF THE REES PIONEER PARK. EVERYONE WHO ATTENDED, ESPECIALLY CHILDREN, WILL REMEMBER MARSHALL DAN OF TELEVISION FAME WHO ATTENDED AS A SPECIAL GUEST. THIS PARTY HAS NOW BECOME AN ANNUAL AFFAIR, AND IN RECENT YEARS, HAS BEEN HELD IN CONJUNCTION WITH THE OPENING SOCIAL IN M. I. A.

A SPECIAL TEMPLE EXCURSION WAS ALSO HELD ON THE WARD'S FIRST ANNIVERSARY. ALMOST EVERYONE IN THE WARD WHO COULD GO ATTENDED THE LOGAN TEMPLE THAT NIGHT. AFTER THE SESSION, A TOUR OF THE TEMPLE WAS CONDUCTED FOR THOSE INTERESTED.

AS WITH MOST OTHER WARDS, THE BRIGHAM NINTH ALSO HOLDS AN ANNUAL WARD DINNER. THIS DINNER IS GENERALLY A FAMILY AFFAIR WITH PLENTY OF DELICIOUS FOOD AND TALENTED PERSONALITIES TO ENTERTAIN ALL WHO COME.

ANOTHER ANNUAL AFFAIR FOR THE ENTIRE FAMILY IS THE RELIEF SOCIETY BAZAAR. THE RELIEF SOCIETY SISTERS WORK ALL YEAR TO PREPARE HANDMADE ITEMS FOR SALE. DINNER IS ALSO SERVED AND MANY VARIETIES OF BAKED GOODS AND CANDY ARE SOLD. THE CHILDREN ARE ENTERTAINED WITH A FISH POND AND LAST YEAR, HAD GUIDED TOURS THROUGH "FANTASY LAND."

MEMBERS OF THE NINTH WARD HAVE MANY REASONS TO BE PROUD OF THEIR WARD, BUT AMONG THE CHIEF REASONS IS THE WARD STANDING AS FAR AS STAKE PROJECTS ARE CONCERNED. WELFARE PROJECTS ESPECIALLY HAVE RECEIVED COURTEOUS AND PROMPT ATTENTION OF THE WARD MEMBERS. WHEN CHERRY PICKING TIME ROLLS AROUND EVERY SUMMER, THE MEMBERS LOOK FORWARD TO MEETING AT THE ORCHARD TO FULFILL THIS ASSIGNMENT. THIS IS ONE TIME WHEN THE SPIRIT OF HELPING ONE ANOTHER AND NEIGHBORLINESS IS REALLY IN EVIDENCE, FOR WHEN A FAMILY FINISHES ITS TREE, THEY USUALLY MOVE ON TO HELP THE NEXT FAMILY.

THE HIGH PRIESTS ALSO HAVE A FRUIT TREE PROJECT EVERY OTHER YEAR. THESE TREES ARE LOCATED ON THE CHURCH GROUNDS, AND THE MEN WHO ARE SO FAITHFUL IN CARING FOR THE FRUIT ARE SURELY TO BE COMPLIMENTED ON THE ABUNDANT HARVEST THEY BRING FORTH.

OUR ELDERS QUORUM IS BY NO MEANS SLACK IN CARRYING OUT THEIR PROJECTS. BESIDES HAULING HAY OR POURING CEMENT ON THE STAKE FARM, THEY HAVE COVERED AND REPAIRED THE FOLDING CHAIRS IN THE CHURCH HOUSE, SHINGLED ROOFS, AND SOLD EGGS AND COMMODITIES, JUST TO MENTION A FEW.

OUR WARD IS VERY PROUD OF ITS YOUNG PEOPLE. THE EXPLORER POST WAS CHOSEN TO ATTEND JUNE CONFERENCE IN 1964 AND WAS THERE NAMED ONE OF THE TOP TWENTY-FIVE POSTS IN THE ENTIRE CHURCH. THE BOYS AND GIRLS HAVE ALSO BROUGHT MANY TROPHIES TO THE WARD IN RECOGNITION OF OUTSTANDING ATHLETIC ABILITIES.

MUSIC PLAYS AN IMPORTANT PART IN THE LIVES OF ALL LDS PEOPLE, AND OUR WARD CHOIR HAS ALWAYS ADDED MUCH TO THE SPIRIT AND CONGENIALITY OF OUR MEETINGS. THIS GROUP HAS BEEN NOTED FOR THE BEAUTIFUL MUSIC THEY RENDER, WITH SPECIAL EMPHASIS ON CHRISTMAS AND EASTER CONTATAS.

TO COMMEMORATE THE RESTORATION OF THE AARONIC PRIESTHOOD, THE BOYS AND THEIR LEADERS ANNUALLY PLAN AN EXCURSION TO SOME INTERESTING OR HISTORICAL PLACE. ONE TRIP WHICH WILL LONG BE REMEMBERED BY ALL WHO ATTENDED WAS IN MAY OF 1963, WHEN THE GROUP WENT TO SALT LAKE CITY. THEY TOURED THE CHURCH OFFICE BUILDING AND OTHER INTERESTING SPOTS, BUT THE HIGHLIGHT OF THE DAY WAS WHEN THEY WERE PRIVILEGED TO MEET AND SHAKE HANDS WITH PRESIDENT DAVID O. MCKAY AND HIS COUNSELORS, PRESIDENT HENRY D. MOYLE AND PRESIDENT HUGH B. BROWN.

IT HAS NOW BECOME VERY EVIDENT THAT ALTHOUGH THE BRIGHAM NINTH IS A RELATIVELY YOUNG WARD, IT HAS TAKEN OFF WITH A FLYING START AND CONTINUES IN THE SAME FINE MANNER IN WHICH IT BEGAN SEVEN YEARS AGO. WE NOW LOOK FORWARD IN ANTICIPATION OF THE FUTURE, AND WITH THE SUPPORT OF ALL MEMBERS OF THE WARD, FUTURE UNDERTAKINGS SHOULD PROVE TO BE EVEN MORE GLORIOUS THAN PAST ONES. HATS OFF TO THE BRIGHAM CITY NINTH!!!
