

Paradise Man Dies Thursday

Funeral services were conducted Saturday at Paradise, Cache county, for George S. Richman, 76, who died Tuesday after a brief illness.

Mr. Richman was the father of Mrs. Don (Edna) Nelson, Brigham City.

He was born Sept. 26, 1884 at Paradise, a son of John W. and Jane C. Sinfield Richman. He married Stella Thomas on Dec. 12, 1906, in the Logan LDS temple.

Mr. Richman was a cattleman and had been employed by Browning Cattle Assn. and Bear Lake Cattlemen's Assn.

Ex-Ogdenite Among Six Killed in Idaho

A 62-year-old former Ogden woman died in an automobile accident near Idaho Falls late Tuesday that also claimed the life of her husband and two other Wyoming couples.

She was Mrs. Jane Richman Jones Hoopes, who moved from Ogden to Fairview, Wyo., in 1966 following her marriage to Vernon Hoopes, 69.

The other victims were identified as Julian Hoopes, 75, his wife, Lorilla, 74; Duard Erickson, 59, and his wife, Vera, 58, all of Fairview.

The six persons were killed when their car plunged over a 300-foot near-perpendicular cliff on Granite Dugway hill about 35 miles east of Idaho Falls. The wreckage, invisible from the highway, was not spotted until Wednesday.

LAUNCH SEARCH

A search was launched early Wednesday after a son of Duard and Vera Erickson told police the group had not returned home from a trip to Idaho Falls.

The party left Ririe, Idaho, about 3 p.m. Tuesday for Fairview following a visit to the Idaho Falls LDS Temple.

An Idaho state trooper found the wreckage after spotting tracks of the vehicle leading off the road.

The car apparently had gone out of control and plunged over the 300-foot embankment, flipping over and throwing the victims from the vehicle.

WORK TWO HOURS

The Bonneville County Sheriff's Jeep Patrol worked two hours with snowmobiles to remove the bodies.

Mrs. Hoopes was born Dec. 5, 1906, in Paradise, Utah, a daughter of John Samuel and Isabell Louise Miles Richman.

She was married to George Leland Jones on Dec. 5, 1928, in Ogden. He died Dec. 2, 1947.

She was married to Alfred Callon on Nov. 3, 1960, in Ogden. He died July 13, 1962. She was married to Vernon Hoopes on Jan. 6, 1966, in Willard. He died March 4, 1969.

Mrs. Hoopes was an active member of the Fairview LDS Ward Relief Society.

She left Ogden for Fairview in 1966.
