



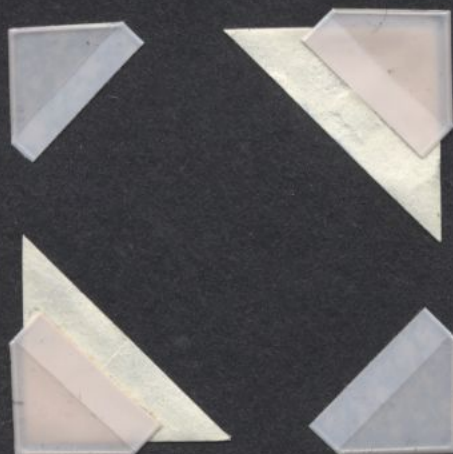

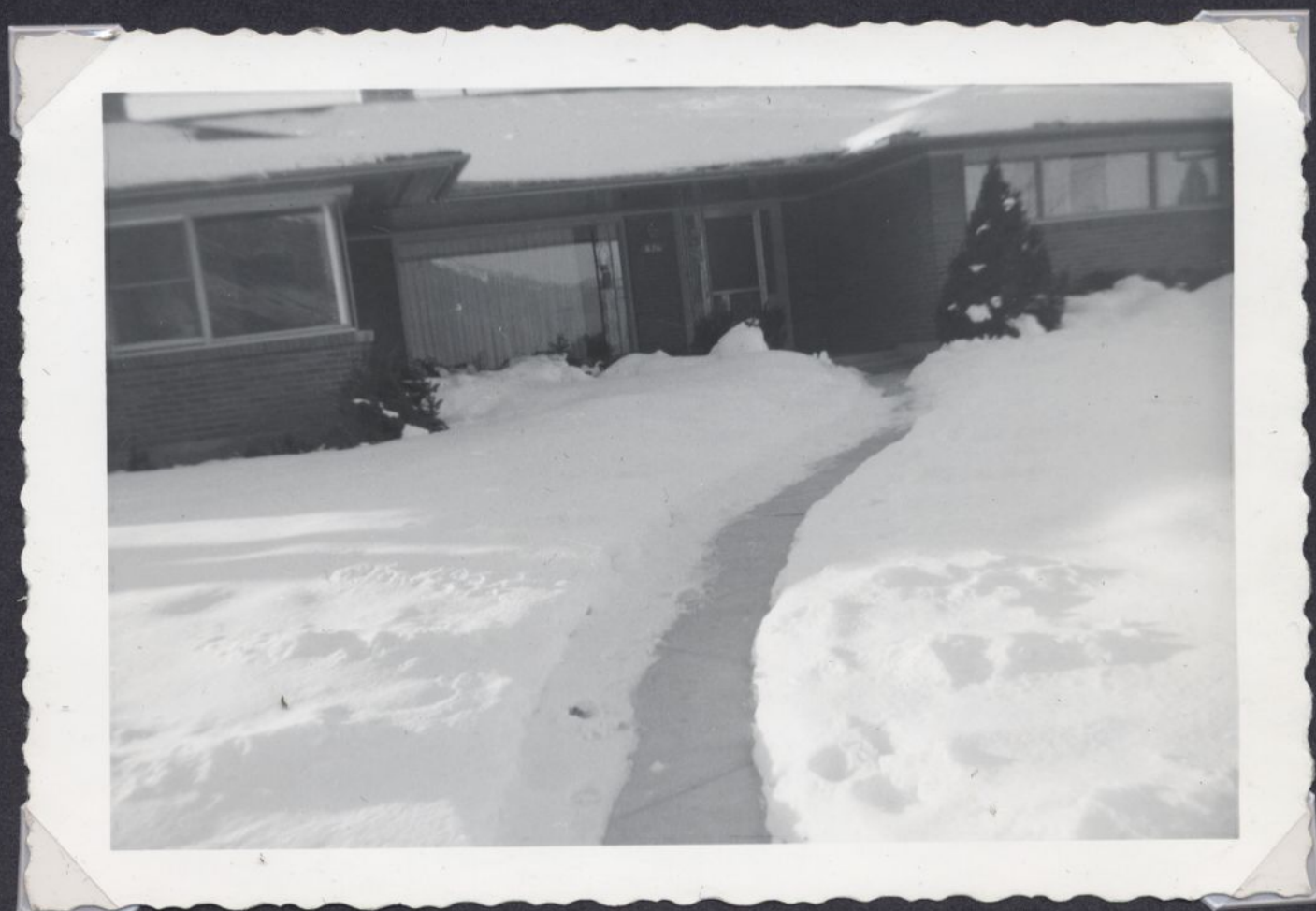

High School Student Wins Lions Peace Essay Contest

A 17-year-old Box Elder High school student has won the Brigham City Lions club's peace essay contest.

He is David K. Norton, son of Mr. and Mrs. McLaine Norton, 1093 Maple drive in Brigham City.

His selection from among six finalists was announced Wednesday evening at a banquet in the Tropical restaurant.

As the winner, he was presented a \$50 savings bond, a trophy from Palmer Jewelry and a distinctive certificate of achievement from the president of Lions International.

YOUNG NORTON'S essay will now be submitted in competition with other local winners in District 28-U and could advance to multi-district and international competition.

Some \$50,000 in awards will be made in the international essay competition, described as the largest peace essay contest in the world.

Judging in Brigham City was done by retired teacher Mabel Christensen, City Librarian Lappreal Wight and teacher Jerry Wilde, a Lions club member.

DON J. CHADWICH who made the presentations Wednesday, said the contest was initiated "to stimulate and elicit the views of today's youth on peace."

He invited other clubs and organizations in Brigham City to invite Norton to read his essay, entitled "Peace Is Attainable."
