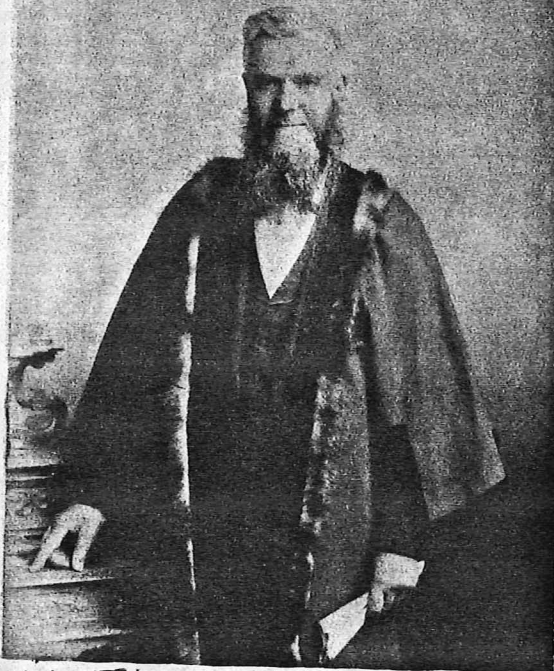
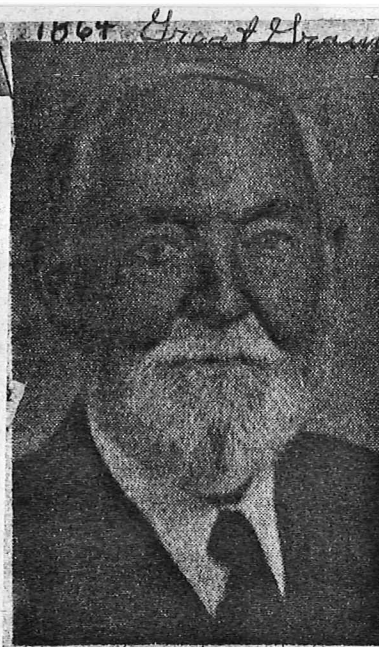

Malta—John Ernest Thompson, father of Bishop J. Henry Thompson, was honored at a birthday dinner, Sunday, March 9. He was born 83 years ago on March 10 in Harrogate, England, and is the last member of a family of thirteen children.

He has led an eventful life since he left his home, where his father manufactured furniture and carpentered.

homestead near Almo and pioneered in a log cabin, while raising their family. They came to Malta, after their oldest son married and settled here. After his wife died Grandpa Thompson, as everyone calls him, went to Logan and did temple work for four years. He is now living with Bishop Thompson, at whose home his birthday was commemorated.

JOHN HARMON THOMPSON Thompson to serve as PR assistant

BORN 21 OCT 1926

John H. Thompson will serve as Acting Assistant Director of Public Relations and Community Services at Ricks College.

Prior to his assignment at Ricks, Thompson has taught music and math in high schools in Spanish Fork, Utah, Malta, Idaho, and Riverside, Calif. He was seminary teacher at the Bonneville Seminary in Idaho Falls. He was Director of the Reno L.D.S. Institute of Religion and Coordinator of the Western Nevada District Seminaries until 1966 when he joined the Ricks' Public Relations Department. Thompson also teaches classes for the BYU-Ricks Center and lectures for the BYU Education Weeks.

Thompson received his B.S. degree in 1957 from Brigham Young University where he also received his M. Ed. degree in 1961. Graduate work towards a doctorate has been done at Utah State University.

JOHN HUGH THOMPSON

Funeral services for John Hugh Thompson, 10, will be held at 1:30 p.m. Friday, Aug. 19, in the Rexburg LDS Ninth Ward Chapel, corner of 3rd W. and 4th S. Bishop Alden Partrich will officiate.

John Hugh Thompson was the son of John Harmon Thompson, formerly of Malta, and was the last of five generations of John Thompsons and the third generation of John H. Thompsons.

John Thompson I (1824), of Harrogate, Yorkshire, England, was the father of John Ernest Thompson II (1864), who moved to America, settling first in Almo and then Malta. His son, John Henry Thompson III (1896) was postmaster at Malta for 42 years. Dr. John Harmon Thompson IV (1926) was born and raised at Malta, graduating from Raft River High School in 1944. He is now assistant director of public relations at Ricks College in Rexburg.

John Hugh Thompson V was born Aug. 6, 1967 in Rexburg and lived all his life there. He had just turned 10 years of age this month and was active as a Bear Cub Scout. He loved baseball and was happy and interested in life.

JOHN HUGH THOMPSON (10): We planned our annual family reunion to be in Burley this year because dad had requested that he wanted to go to the Cassia County Fair and Rodeo. Our Reunion was sadly interrupted by the untimely death of JOHN HUGH THOMPSON. HUGH was the last of five generations of John Thompsons, and the third generation of John H. Thompsons. John Thompson I (1824), Alderman on the town Council of Harrogate, Yorkshire, England, had 13 children three of which he named John, including number 13 whom he named JOHN ERNEST THOMPSON. JOHN ERNEST THOMPSON II (1864), who immigrated to America, had 5 children, the eldest he named JOHN HENRY THOMPSON. J. HENRY THOMPSON III (1896), who was postmaster at Malta, Cassia County, Idaho, for 42 years, had 7 children and named his eldest son John. JOHN HARMON THOMPSON IV (1926), assistant Director of Public Relations at Ricks College in Rexburg, Idaho, is the father of JOHN HUGH THOMPSON V (1967), who was killed 16 Aug 77 when he was accidentally pinned under tractor with a fork lift in about three feet of water in the Rexburg Cannal about 50 yards from the Thompson home.

Funeral. The family settled in England and it was there they met the LDS Missionaries, were converted and joined the church. He is the only one of his father's family to
